Regional Training Partnership Launched

Last month saw the launch of the East Midlands Regional Training Partnership (RTP). RTPs are the way in which the Church of England has agreed with other churches to organise training for ministry. The partnership consists of the churches in the region and training colleges and courses. Director of Development for the Diocese, the Revd Canon Alan Payne, said: "In the East Midlands trainers in the churches and college and course leaders have been meeting together in a consortium for some time, and we also have an ecumenical part time ordination course. Falling numbers of ordinands and changes in University policy have created issues of viability for this course and Higher Education funding rules have meant that we

needed to look for a new university partner for our Certificate in Christian Discipleship. We have now come to an agreement to replace the EMMTC course with a new course with Lincoln School of Theology, to set up the RTP to coordinate this and other ministry training in the region. It is hoped that this will avoid duplication, enhance the capacity in the region to offer training leading to recognized qualifications, and enable greater collaboration in the provision of training and resourcing of one another". The RTP was launched with a study day led by Professor Clemens Sedmak of Kings College London, and an act of worship in which the leaders of the East Midlands Churches, St John's

Shrinking the footprint in every parish

A senior bishop and a Government minister spelled out the importance of the Church of England's role in mobilising action on climate change, as its Shrinking the Footprint campaign unveiled energy saving toolkits for every parish in a bid to create the 20% Church by 2050.

Speaking at Lambeth Palace, the Bishop of London, the Rt Revd Richard Chartres urged representatives from all dioceses to go one step further in cutting the carbon reminding them that caring for the planet is a Christian imperative for the sake of future generations.

New toolkits and resources with energy saving tips and guidance for the CofE's churches, cathedrals, schools and clergy homes are now available at www.shrinkingthefootprint.org. These include downloadable action plans and checklists along with advice on considering the appropriate use of renewable energy in church buildings.

These resources are part of the CofE's Carbon Management Programme (CMP), undertaken by AECOM (formerly Faber Maunsell) on behalf of the Carbon Trust which looked at the institutional footprint of the Church estimated to be around a third of a million tonnes.

The CMP report shows that by ensuring energy is used efficiently in cathedrals and church buildings - updating lighting and heating with more efficient alternatives, adjusting time switches, checking thermostats, installing insulation and stopping draughts - the Church of England could reduce this footprint by as much as 12% or almost 27,000 tCO₂e.

"Bishop George really understands that the church has to be more efficient and be smarter if it is to do God's work effectively and has worked so hard to raise the profile of the Diocese of Southwell and Nottingham both nationally and internationally."

Growing Greener – bit by bit

Around seventy people came to Southwell Minster on the morning of Saturday June 6th for an event to mark the first anniversary of Growing Greener Churches, our Diocesan Environment Policy. They were warmly welcomed by Dean John and Bishop George and heard an excellent talk by Martyn Goss from Exeter Diocese. Martyn combined science and theology in an interesting and understandable way, then went on to talk about the implications for us as Christians in our lives and our worship. The questions afterwards showed that the audience had been both challenged and encouraged by his presentation.*

The Marketplace was then open for business, with displays by St Leonards, Wollaton on being an Eco-Congregation church and pictures from Halam and Edingley churchyards on wildlife-friendly projects. There was also information about low-energy light bulbs, Sherwood Pines Forest Park, Hockerton Housing Project and Southwell Transition Town group.



Shelagh Baird-Smith, Diocesan Environment Officer, said: “I’m glad that people were able to go away having been challenged to do more, but with some practical help and ideas to encourage them. The number of Green Champions in the parishes is growing steadily as more churches realise that Growing Greener is not hard but can be a way to engage with local communities and have some fun too”.

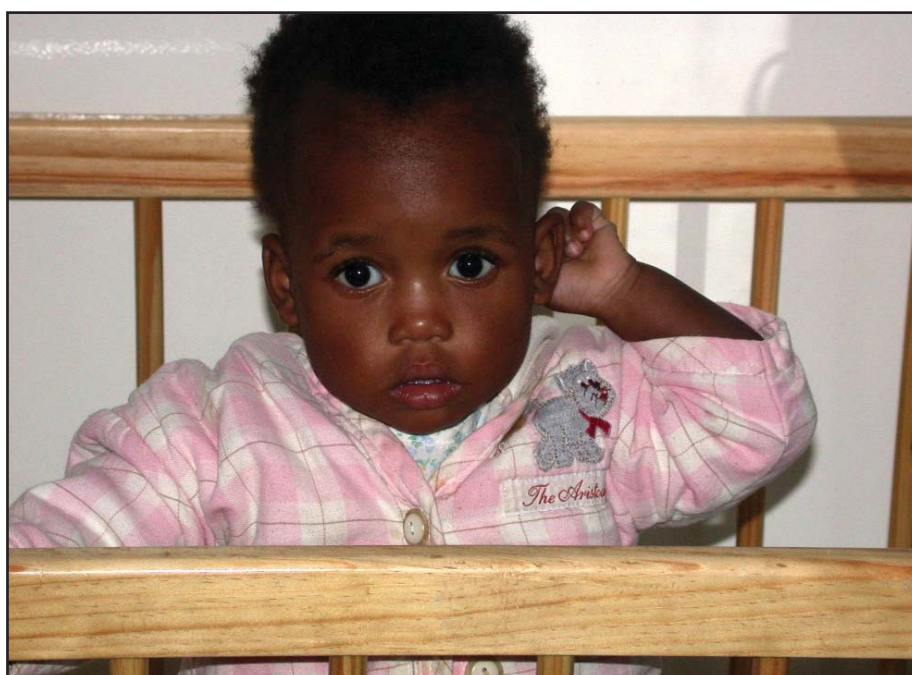

Natal News & Information

Planning for a Young People's Visit to Natal

Over two years ago St Mary's Arnold hosted two members of the group visiting from Natal. They met with the young people's group and afterwards their youth worker JR challenged the youth to take their inspiration from this and turn it into something tangible. They put on a Fashion Show and raised funds for those suffering with HIV & AIDS. Subsequent Fashion Shows helped them to sponsor three children from South America, Asia & Africa.



When the young people's group heard about the 'Soul in the City' trip to Durban at Soul Survivor that summer, the idea of a Link visit was born. Initially there were eight young adults hoping to make the trip – although four later had to drop out - working for two weeks and travelling for another. They planned to spend the next twelve months raising £1500 each. JR was intent on developing their passion and commitment to the trip in the early stages, keen to impress upon them that they needed to demonstrate a respect for the cultural differences and a level of maturity.

The group (Dillon, Amy, Jonathan & JR) began fundraising but JR was clear that fundraising as a group wouldn't

bring in enough money, they would need to think about their own contribution. They wrote to family & friends before Christmas asking them to consider contributing to their Natal fund rather than buy them presents this year. Some of the young people took on work in their spare time. They hadn't seen themselves working in a supermarket and were worried that their friends might see them but managed to overcome their prejudices and get a job to raise their share. One young person took on gardening work and, even though he had to drop out of the trip, gave the money he had raised to the others in the group. Working in the community and talking about it at school gave them opportunities to witness to why they were travelling to Natal

and how the idea had started.

With just one month to go before they depart the young people are bringing together their last share of the funds required. For some their family has had to help them out. For another it has meant extra shifts at the supermarket and not going out with friends for a while to save more money. When asked how the young people were feeling JR said, "They're so excited they can't sleep!"
