Call for churches to buy a bus stop for Christmas

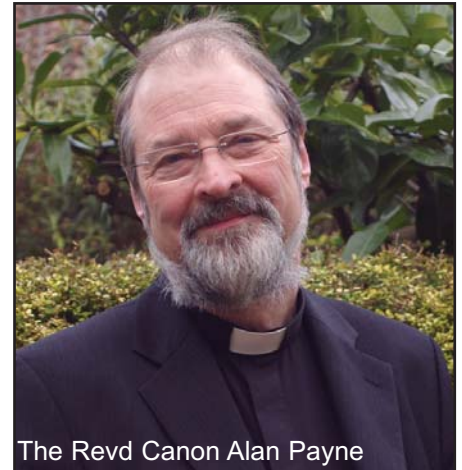
Changes in development

Two members of the Department for Development will be leaving in the next few weeks, both David Jones – the Urban Officer for the Diocese and Alan Payne, Director of Development & Priest-in-Charge of Lambley, will be retiring soon. Chief Executive, Nigel Spraggins said: “We wish both Alan and David well in this new stage of their lives and give thanks for all that they have achieved for the diocese over the years. Their retirements have been an opportunity to consider if there were tweaks that would be beneficial for the department for the future. The greater clarity of the impact of Clergy Terms of Service and the coming into being of the Regional Training Partnership mean there is a different environment for training. Also the willingness of

other sectors to partner with the diocese and the openings that have emerged mean that we should capitalise on this mission opportunity. It is therefore important that the voices of ministry (particularly training) and partnerships should be heard separately in those places where policy and strategy are developed.”

This has led to some changes in The Department for Development, which will now have two teams within it - with ‘Ministry and Mission’ led by Nigel Rooms and ‘Partnerships and Mission’ led by David McCoulough. The re-organisation has led to the creation of three new roles including: a Clergy Training Officer, a Partnerships Officer, which will look to develop partnerships between the Diocese, deaneries and parishes with other bodies and a third post of an Urban Officer, which will be a complementary role to the current Rural Officer post, will be put on hold until the departmental staffing budget allows.

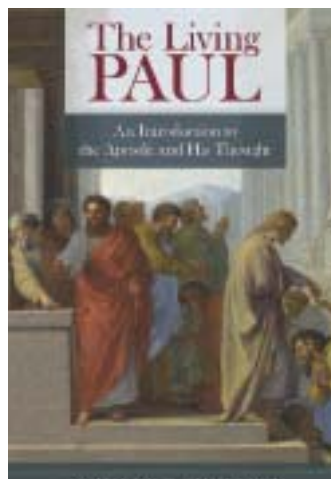

Natal News & Information

Anticipating endings and beginnings

Link Officer, Barbara Holbrook writes:

As we get to this time of year, one of the big differences between Natal and Southwell and Nottingham is highlighted. Just as our schools are settling in to their year, South Africans are looking forward to their summer holidays. Schools break up over the Christmas period for their long summer break, and in the new year starts the new school year, so for them this is a time of anticipating endings and beginnings.

For some young people, they will be leaving school for the last time. The challenge of finding work is as prevalent in South Africa as it is here. The churches in Natal have a lot to teach us about working in their community. Everyone who visits them cannot help but be astounded by the work that the churches are doing in providing assistance to child headed households, AIDS victims and the many needy people around them.

There is also a need for working with entrepreneurs in the churches who are looking to start businesses. How do we help them develop their work and benefit the people around them? How do we help the businesses to be



founded on Christian principles? The people in the townships of Natal do not recognise the Fair Trade logo, ethical purchasing decisions are the province of the rich like ourselves, but we all need to learn from the mistakes that we in the west have made in exploitative commerce and unfair trade..

While Bishop Rubin was over with us at the end of October, we had a visit from Mike Clargo of Reconxile, and next year a few of us will have the chance to visit Natal and share some of his insights in mentoring and supporting new and developing businesses run by our brothers and sisters in Natal, and to pass on Mike's insights so that the people of Natal can provide such mentoring in the future. If you would like to be part of that, let us know as soon as possible.



Meanwhile, this month please pray for all those who are preparing to leave school and full time education, and those families for whom the provision of school fees is a difficult burden to bear.
